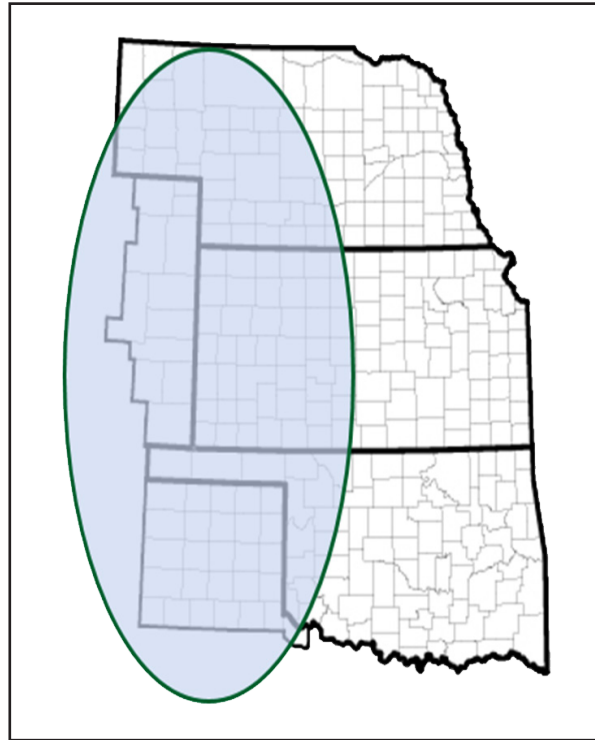

Comments

A new hard white wheat from Kansas Wheat Alliance with an excellent yield record. Joe has good resistance to both stripe and leaf rust, as well as wheat streak mosaic virus. Its pre-harvest sprouting is not quite as good as Danby but is average.

Joe is a medium-tall, medium-late variety and will do well in Western Kansas and Eastern Colorado.

Strengths:

- Excellent yield potential
- Moderately resistant to wheat streak mosaic virus, stripe rust, and leaf rust
- Good straw strength

Weaknesses:

- Not quite as good of pre-harvest sprouting as Danby
- Susceptible to soilborne-mosaic virus
